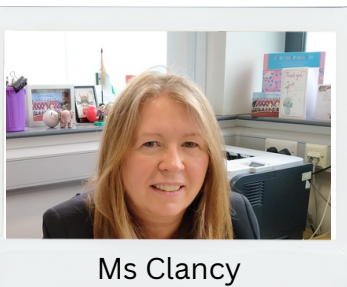
Ms Clancy

Mrs Martina Lennon is a Senior Teacher in De La Salle High School and throughout her career, her teaching philosophy has been rooted in the Lasallian values of faith, service and community.

Mrs Lennon has held a number of teaching and leadership roles.

As Head of Mathematics, she was responsible for leading the department to secure high standards of learning and teaching. As the school's Numeracy Co-ordinator, she works closely with Heads of Department and teachers to ensure high quality standards in Numeracy Across the Curriculum. She also served as Head of Year, leading year groups of students and Form Teachers, providing pastoral care, support and guidance. Additionally, she worked as Examinations Officer, managing internal and external assessments. As a Senior Leader, Mrs Lennon fosters collaborative leadership and a supportive, equitable school culture. Alongside her teaching roles, Mrs Lennon is also a school Governor.

In conjunction with her roles within school and in the spirit of continuous learning, on invitation from the Education Authority, Mrs Lennon took up a Systems Leadership Role of Heads of Mathematics across several schools.

Further Recruitment

The Senior Leader, Learning Support Co-ordinator (SENCO), Pupil Progress and Support Leaders (Heads of Year) and a number of Head of Department posts have been advertised. It is hoped to finalise a number of these appointments this month.

2. Pupil Forums

Dr Moore and staff have continued to engage with pupils in planning for the opening of Lecale Trinity Grammar School.

Student Transition Sub-Group

The pupils have been working on the design of a pupil-friendly version of the Progress Update. The pupils, in partnership with staff, have looked at a more accessible design for pupils that will chart the progress and share information on key areas and issues that they have identified as most important to them and which therefore, should be included in the e-book.

You can access the booklet by clicking on the link above and the pupils will add to the content as the year progresses. Included in the booklet is information on the crest, uniform, sites, curriculum and Transition events.

Dr Moore has held meetings with focus groups of pupils of all three schools to discuss and share ideas around transition programmes for each year group. As a result, the following transition days have been planned:

A very successful Transition and Options event was held for all Year 10 and Year 12 pupils on 9th February in St Patrick's Grammar School. The pupils came together and engaged in team building activities facilitated by Learn Spark and attended information sessions on pathways and options, with input from University of Ulster.

Transition events for all groups have been organised with a focus on transition, team building and resilience and will take place on 18th April and 19th April. Year 8 pupils will attend St Mary's for the event, and De La Salle High School will host all other year groups.

Student Ethos Strategic Sub-Group

The Student Ethos Sub-Group has met to review the core values underpinning the school's commitment to 'Faith in Every Child' and to consider a draft Mission Statement. This builds on the excellent ethos work undertaken in partnership with staff of all three schools, and takes cognisance of consultation findings. Further work will continue with this process in the next few weeks, as staff, pupils and Governors collaborate to finalise the draft Mission Statement for consultation.

Student Curriculum Strategic Sub-Groups

Dr Moore and the Vice-Principals have continued to meet with Curriculum Focus Groups of students regarding the curriculum for next year. They have also continued to working closely with the Principals and Senior Teachers responsible for options and curriculum in St Mary's High School, De La Salle High School and St Patrick's Grammar School. As a result, the timetabling process is well underway.

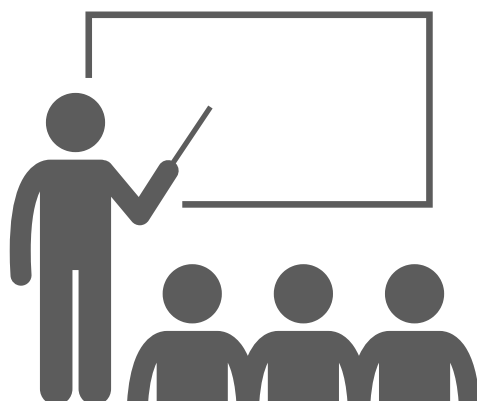
3. Admissions

The Education Authority's Admissions portal has closed and the admission process for Year 8 pupils is now underway. The school will align with the Education Authority key date of advising parents of the outcome of applications from 18th May.

It has been proposed that Year 8 pupils, along with Year 9 pupils, will be based on the Mercy Site. To ensure appropriate class placement, the school will link closely with partner primary schools to assist in the placement of pupils into classes. This will include visits by the Key Stage 3 Team, including Heads of Year and the Learning Support Coordinator (SENCO) to review the academic progress of each pupil and to highlight any pastoral needs. Cognitive Ability Assessments (CATs) will also be used in Lecale Trinity Grammar to aid the organisation of class groupings. CATs will be used to assess a pupil's ability in three areas: verbal (thinking with words); quantitative (thinking with numbers); non-verbal (thinking with shapes and space). These results will also help the school to benchmark, set targets in each subject area, identify areas of support and challenge, and measure the impact of learning and teaching. CAT Assessments will be carried out as part of the Transition Process for pupils before the end of summer term.

4. Classes for Lecale Trinity Grammar School

The process of meeting with the Pastoral Teams in all three school to ensure appropriate placement of current pupils is underway. This will include review of pastoral information and academic performance, including the use of CAT scores. The commitment given to pupils in Years 11 and 13 to progress into the new academic year with current teachers where possible has also been a major factor in the timetabling design.



5. Uniform

It is wonderful to see the full uniform which has been agreed with the suppliers. We thank them for their continued support and advice in this important process. You can see a copy of the school uniform in the pupil's e-book that accompanies this update.

Dr Moore, and members of the PE departments in all three schools, have begun the process of engaging with pupil focus groups around the design of the new PE uniform. We look forward to sharing more information on this area with you through our e-book.



6. Accommodation

Dr Moore, the Bursar Designate, the Chair and Vice Chair of the Interim Board of Governors have held several meetings with key decision makers to lobby for and exert maximum influence to ensure that capital investment is secured for accommodation requirements, including minor works, on both sites. These meetings have included the Chief Executive of CCMS and a meeting on the Mercy site with DE and Education Authority officials. We have also communicated in writing with the Permanent Secretary for Education and the Minister for Education. We are pleased to share with you that the outcome of this tireless action is the Minister's decision to visit the sites in April. We look forward to meeting Mr Givan and doing everything in our power to impress upon him the need for adequate investment in Lecale Trinity Grammar School.

7. Communication



There are several important developments which we want to share with you.

The Website

The development of a website for Lecale Trinity Grammar School is in progress and we hope to launch the finalised website shortly.

Meetings with Parents

Dr Moore and her team have continued to hold meetings with parents. These meetings, covering a variety of issues including admissions, class setting and special needs have been most constructive.

Meetings with Staff

Dr Moore and the two Vice Principals are also committed to hosting meetings with the staff from the three schools on a regular basis to share information and respond to queries.

Meetings with Primary School Partners

Dr Moore continues to value all opportunities to meet with Primary Principals whose advice and feedback are very significant in the shared journey ahead. She was delighted to have attended the excellent Lecale Principals seminar.

The Chair and Dr Moore continue to meet with the trade unions on a regular basis.
