

# Microsoft Teams

- Blended approach to learning (online + classroom).
- Students have a MS Team for every subject.
- Students should use Teams to check homework, access resources and communicate with teacher and classmates regarding work outside the classroom.
- If absent, students will be expected to use Teams to complete classwork missed and homework.



# School Gateway App

- The App provides:
- Communication between school and home. (E.g. Notice of absence/appointments)
- Access to timetable.
- Access to school reports.
- School news and events.

### **Pastoral Matters**

#### **Attendance:**

- Make ALL appointments, e.g. dental after school whenever possible;
- Holidays during term time cannot be sanctioned by the school;
- Sign in and out of school for all appointments;
- Notes signed by FT during registration on the day of the appointment or the day before, if you are arriving to school late.

Attendance percentages can be misleading.

100% Attendance	0 Days Missed	Excellent
95% Attendance	9 Days of Absence 1 Week and 4 Days of Learning Missed	Satisfactory
90% Attendance	19 Days of Absence 3 Weeks and 4 Days of Learning Missed	Poor
85% Attendance	28 Days of Absence 5 Weeks and 3 Days of Learning Missed	Very Poor
80% Attendance	38 Days of Absence 7 Weeks and 3 Days of Learning Missed	Unacceptable
75% Attendance	46 Days of Absence 9 Weeks and 1 Day of Learning Missed	Unacceptable

For some parents, 90% may seem like an acceptable level of attendance, but the reality is that 90% attendance means that your child will miss half a school day each week or 19 days of school during the school year – that's nearly 4 school weeks.



### **Punctuality:**

- School is preparation for the rest of your life;
- You are expected in school by 9.00am every morning
- If late into school, you must sign in at reception;
- Punctuality will be monitored.





### **Academic Behaviour:**

- Our expectation is that all pupils will complete all work to a high standard;
- Students have targets and should work towards achieving these;
- Students are given every opportunity and encouragement to succeed;
- The school has a system of monitoring homework: note in planner, lunch time detention, after-school detention.

### **Uniform and Behaviour:**

- Be proud to be part of the Red High Community;
- Respect rules regarding hair styles and uniform;
- No hoodie/sport jumper (grey woollen jumper only) black coat OVER blazer;
- Respect others and have a caring attitude;
- Senior school pupils are expected to show increased maturity and responsibility;
- Lead is by example we are an Investors in Pupils school you are a future leader.
